

Effective Learning Environments Observation Tool (ELEOT) Ratings Guide

When observing in classrooms, consider the following factors as you determine the rating for each ELEOT item: Routine and Systemic, Quality of Application, Quantity of Students Applying Item, and Frequency of Application. The factors are listed in order of most to least importance. Thus, the "routine and systemic" category carries more weight than "frequency of application". The rubric which is intended to provide guidance is not the simple average of the four factors. Observers should use professional knowledge and judgment in determining the final item rating based on the rubric below.
